 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Recreation for All5 Act".

6 SEC. 2. INCREASING YOUTH RECREATION VISITS TO FED7 ERAL LAND.

8 (a) STRATEGY.—Not later than 1 year after the date9 of enactment of this Act, and not less frequently than once

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every 5 years thereafter, the Secretary of the Interior and
 the Secretary of Agriculture (referred to in this Act as
 the "Secretaries") shall develop and make public a na tional strategy, after public notice and comment, to in crease the number of youth recreation visits to Federal
 land.

7 (b) REQUIREMENTS.—A strategy developed under
8 subsection (a)—

9 (1) shall—

10 (A) emphasize increased recreation oppor11 tunities on Federal land for underserved youth;
12 (B) establish objectives and quantifiable
13 targets for increasing youth recreation visits;
14 and

15 (C) provide the anticipated costs to achieve
16 the objectives and meet the targets established
17 under subparagraph (B); and

18 (2) shall not establish any preference between
19 similar recreation facilitated by noncommercial or
20 commercial entities.

(c) AGREEMENTS.—The Secretaries may enter into
contracts or cost-share agreements (including contracts or
agreements for the acquisition of vehicles) to carry out
this section.

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1SEC. 3. MONITORING FOR IMPROVED RECREATION DECI-2SIONMAKING.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretaries shall seek to cap4 ture comprehensive recreation use data to better under5 stand and inform decisionmaking by the Secretaries.

6 (b) PILOT PROTOCOLS.—Not later than 1 year after 7 the date of enactment of this Act, and after public notice 8 and comment, the Secretaries shall establish pilot proto-9 cols at not fewer than 10 land management units under the jurisdiction of each of the Secretaries to model recre-10 ation use patterns (including low-use recreation activities 11 12 and dispersed recreation activities) that may not be effectively measured by existing general and opportunistic sur-13 14 vey and monitoring protocols.

15 SEC. 4. INFORMING THE PUBLIC OF ACCESS CLOSURES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretaries shall, to the extent practicable and in a timely fashion, alert the public
to any closure or disruption to public campsites, trails,
roads, and other public areas and access points under the
jurisdiction of the applicable Secretary.

(b) ONLINE ALERT.—An alert under subsection (a)
shall be posted online on a public website of the appropriate land unit in a manner that—

(1) ensures that the public can easily find the
alert in searching for the applicable campsite, trail,
road, or other access point; and

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(2) consolidates all alerts under subsection (a).
 SEC. 5. RECREATION BUDGET CROSSCUT.

3 Not later than 30 days after the end of each fiscal year, beginning with fiscal year 2025, the Director of the 4 5 Office of Management and Budget shall submit to Con-6 gress and make public online a report that describes and itemizes the total amount of funding relating to outdoor 7 recreation that was obligated in the preceding fiscal year 8 in accounts in the Treasury for the Department of the 9 10 Interior and the Department of Agriculture.
